

Oregon DMV Driver's License & Out-of-State Vehicle Transfer Guide

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1. Mandatory 30-Day Residency Rule

- **Residency Definition:** Establishing residency occurs upon purchasing a primary home, obtaining an Oregon job, or enrolling children in school.
- **30-Day Deadline:** Oregon law requires transferring driver's license and vehicle registration within 30 days of establishing residency.

2. DEQ Clean Air Station Emissions Testing

- **Testing Boundary:** Mandatory for vehicles registered in Portland Metro boundary (Multnomah, Washington, Clackamas counties) and Medford.
- **Testing Fee:** \$25 emissions testing fee per vehicle, valid for 2-year registration cycle.
- **DEQ Locations:** Stations located in Beaverton, Hillsboro, Portland, Clackamas, Sherwood, and Medford.

3. Required Identification Documents for Real ID

- **Proof of Identity:** Valid U.S. Passport, original birth certificate, or Permanent Resident Card.
- **Proof of Social Security Number:** Social Security card, W-2 form, or 1099 tax document.
- **Proof of Oregon Residency (2 Documents):** Utility bill, property lease/deed, bank statement, or Oregon voter card showing residential address.

4. Vehicle Title, Plate Fees & Motor Voter Registration

- **Efficiency Fee Schedule:** 2-year registration fees scale based on MPG ratings (higher MPG = slightly higher fee to offset gas tax loss).
- **Oregon Motor Voter:** Eligible citizens are automatically registered to vote when transferring driver's license at DMV.
